## **RULES FOR THE CHAMBERLAIN SHIELD**

- The Chamberlain Shield is an annual interclub competition between teams comprised of the three winners of the current year's Senior, Intermediate and Junior Club Championships.
- The competition is aggregate gross over 36 holes from the club (White) tees.
- If any of the three winners of the grades of championships are unavailable, the Club may substitute the runner-up, semi-finalist, etc, in the correct sequence, in the appropriate championship grade.
- 4 A player may represent only one club in the competition.
- 5 Play will be in either threes or fours depending on the number of teams competing.
- Entries must be received by the Executive Officer no later than five working days prior to the competition and the entry fee will be invoiced to Clubs involved immediately following the event. If a Club enters a team and later withdraws following the closing of entries they will be charged the entry fee.
- 7 The draw will be announced during the week prior to the tournament.
- The host club is responsible for the organisation and control of the day's play and must appoint a disputes and judicial committee which may include a member of the District or his appointee.

- 9 The District will collaborate with the host club in the compilation of the results.
- The tournament winner will be the team with the lowest aggregate gross score.
- 11 When two or more teams have the lowest aggregate score, the winner will be the team scoring the lowest aggregate score in the second 18 holes of the tournament. Remaining ties will be decided in the same manner over the final 9 holes of the tournament. Ties for second place will be decided by the same procedure.
- 12 The winning team will receive the Chamberlain Shield. The District provides trophies for each member of the teams finishing first and second.
- 13 Prizes will be awarded to the senior, intermediate and junior champions with the lowest aggregate gross scores. When two or more individuals have the lowest aggregate score, the winner will be decided by the same procedure as in rule 11 above.
- 14 Additional Competition Lowest aggregate nett score in each of the senior, intermediate and junior divisions over 36 holes.

Recipients of team and gross prizes are ineligible for nett prizes.
